What is the role of Allied Health Assistance (Clinical Assistant)?

Clinical Assistants support and assist Allied Health Professionals (including Audiologists, Physiotherapists, Occupational Therapists, Pharmacists, Social Workers and Speech Pathologists) with their day-to-day patient care and operational tasks including patient health care programming, treatment plans and therapeutic support.

A school based traineeship offers the opportunity for students to kick start their career whilst continuing their Year 11 and 12 studies.

What are the benefits of a school based traineeship?

- Hands on experience working in a real-world environment.
- Receive points towards your Year 12 Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE).
- Contributes toward your Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) (you do not need to be ATAR eligible to apply for a traineeship).
- Real job opportunities at the end of your traineeship.

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Are you the right person for the job?

To be successful in gaining a school based traineeship your application needs to demonstrate these personal attributes:

- **A current Year 10 student** with the ability to commit to a 2-year school based traineeship across Year 11 and Year 12 – this means you need to have the skills, ability and self-motivation to work towards completing a Certificate III in Allied Health Assistance prior to finishing your school education and attend the workplace one day per week.
- **Willingness to learn** – if you are successful in applying for this position, you will be assigned an 'on-the-job supervisor'. Your supervisor will show you how to perform tasks, assign you tasks to complete and assess your workplace competency.
- **A genuine interest in Health** – completing a school based traineeship will allow you the opportunity to explore your pathway into a career in health.

How does a school based traineeship work?

You will attend your traineeship placement at a Sunshine Coast Health facility one day per week (Monday to Friday), on the same day each week. This means you will miss a day of normal schooling each week.

How do I apply?

STEP 1 – Discuss this opportunity with your parent/guardian, school (VET coordinator) and teachers.

STEP 2 – Ensure you can get to your nominated Sunshine Coast Health facility one day per week. As applications will be assessed based on your home location, please only select the facility within your school's catchment area.

STEP 3 – Complete the online application form.

When do applications open?
