

## Rationale

In accordance with section 360 of the *Education (General Provisions) Act 2006 (QLD)*, a principal may develop a student dress code that will apply when students are attending, or representing, the school. When developing a dress code, the principal must ensure it is compliant with guidelines, as described in this procedure.

Burnside State High School dress standards reflect the community expectations and standards as determined by the Principal in consultation with school community representatives.

### Aims

Burnside State High School believes that a clearly stated and sensibly implemented Uniform Policy is important for the following reasons:

- To provide a disciplined learning focus, setting the scene in a classroom environment.
- To provide a sense of identity for students attending the school.
- To provide an opportunity for parents and staff to instil in students a sense of pride in their appearance.
- To provide a united team and increase school spirit.

It is our policy that the correct school uniform is worn each day and we urge all parents to support the accepted standard of dress as detailed in this brochure. The Burnside State High School uniform can only be purchased from the school uniform shop.

**NOTE:** Formal uniform must be worn on Mondays and on excursions. Either uniform is permitted on other days. Formal and Day uniforms must not be mixed and matched.

**NOTE:** The volleyball attire (volleyball shirt, shorts and tracksuit pants) is not school uniform. The volleyball PESV shirt is only to be worn if the student has PESV classes on that day.

**HAIR:** Neat, clean and tidy. Long hair must be tied back. Exotic, bright, or unnaturally coloured hairstyles are not acceptable; this includes features such as extravagant ornamental hair clips and decorations, hair extensions and excessive braiding/plaiting.

**JEWELLERY:** 1 stud or small sleeper earring in each ear, 1 ring and 1 watch. No bracelets or anklets are permitted. No necklaces should be visible at any time.

**Note:** No visible body/facial piercings e.g. nose, brow, lip studs or rings. Facial piercings must be removed for school. In the short term, they may be covered with protective tape, for a period of six weeks to allow the healing process or filled with a retainer available from piercing suppliers.

**TATTOOS/BODY ART:** Must be covered at all times.

**MAKE-UP:** Visible make-up is not permitted. Nail polish is not permitted.

**JUMPERS:** An approved school jumper or a plain navy jumper/cardigan is suitable for winter. Jumpers **MUST NOT** have a hood or emblem/logo.

**SHOES:** Must be completely black with black laces. No coloured logos or white or coloured soles are permitted. No boots or high tops of any type are permitted.

**HATS:** Must be completely navy. **MUST NOT** have an emblem/logo.
